*Issues in Teacher Education* is a peer-reviewed journal published twice yearly by the California Council on Teacher Education (CCTE). The Fall 2009 issue of ITE will focus on online, hybrid, and technology integrated teaching and learning within teacher education. Teacher education is broadly defined to include pre-service preparation, the induction years, and the professional development of career teachers.

Original manuscripts focused on related topics are sought. The emphasis is on improving the quality of teacher education. Topics may include but are not limited to:

- Best practices for online courses in teacher education.
- Best practices for hybrid (or blended) courses in teacher education.
- Assessing effectiveness of hybrid and online courses for teacher education.
- Preparing teachers for K-12 online and hybrid teaching and learning.
- Technology as agent for teacher support and development (including online video case studies, ePortfolios, wikis, blogs, podcasts, smart devices, gaming, and other technologies).

*Issues in Teacher Education* welcomes submissions in a variety of formats: research studies, essays, opinion papers, descriptions of exemplary programs, reports of innovations in the clinical aspects of teaching, legislative summaries, book reviews, etc. Submissions range from 500 to 5,000 words, with the average printed article around 3,000 words.

Manuscripts should be 6-20 pages in length, double-spaced, and referenced in APA (5th Edition) format. *Issues in Teacher Education* will return manuscripts, unread, that do not meet acceptable style standards.

Submissions should be emailed as two attached documents. The first attachments should be the manuscript with the title appearing on page 1 without reference to the author(s) and a running title should appear in the header. The second manuscript attachment should include a cover sheet containing the title, author(s), professional affiliation(s), email address(es). As a third attachment, please provide a separate cover page that includes author's name, title, institution, mail and e-mail addresses, voice and FAX numbers, a brief professional sketch (3-5 sentences), and a statement that the manuscript is not under consideration for publication elsewhere. Authors of accepted manuscripts will be asked to submit a final version in electronic formats with graphic material in camera-ready format
