Responsibilities

Significant scholarship is an expectation of the position. Additional requirements include: desire to create innovative programs and experiences for pre-service and in-service teachers, expertise in the use of assessment and evidence based practice, familiarity with common core standards and next generation assessments, commitment to collaboration, experience with student-centered environments, and an understanding of educating for a culturally diverse society. Preference may be given to candidates with a background in teaching at the middle or high school level. Scholarly interests in, but not limited to, Pk-12 student outcomes, teacher preparation, teacher professional development, urban education, school-based research, school-community connections, and/or second language acquisition is desirable.

Tenure track faculty are expected to develop and maintain an active research agenda for future tenure consideration and are evaluated on their research/scholarly activity, teaching and service.
