BACKGROUND

The Teacher Education Division at Fresno Pacific University offers the Multiple Subjects and Single Subject credential programs as well as credentials and the Master of Arts in Teaching. Programs are offered at the university's home campus in Southeast Fresno, and also at three regional centers: Merced, Bakersfield, and Visalia. The credential programs have experienced significant numerical growth over the last four years. Opportunities for leadership within the division are available.

ROLE: Teaching professor and lead instructor in the teacher education division with an emphasis on teaching English Learners and Multicultural Education.

DUTIES:

- Teach courses preparing students to work with linguistically and culturally diverse populations in both elementary and secondary school settings:
 - o Instruct students whose first language is not English;
 - o Instruct students within a multi-cultural setting;
- Serve as a lead teacher for the courses preparing students to work with linguistically and culturally diverse populations;
- Work with program directors to assist in addressing issues related to teaching in linguistically and culturally diverse populations in both elementary and a secondary school settings and make on-going course revisions in response to changes in the clinical and regulatory environments influencing the teacher education program;
- Maintain clinical relationships through the mentoring of student teachers or work with local schools and other agencies;
- Maintain an active scholarly agenda.

Qualifications: Required

- Terminal degree in Education with an emphasis on teaching English Learners and Multicultural Education or closely related field;
- Commitment to preparing teachers to work in diverse and high poverty schools:
- Record of successful teaching (K-12) or experience working with school settings (K-12);
- Working knowledge of Common Core Standards; including the CA ELD standards;
- Ability to work collegially with students, staff and faculty;
- Successful experience teaching college or post-BA students;
- Record or promise of scholarly achievement;
- Excellent skills in communication;
- Commitment to the Christian faith and the University's mission of Christ-centered teaching and learning, and involvement in a local church.

Recommended:

- Knowledge of, and experience with, bilingualism and bilingual education;
- Experience teaching in a linguistically/culturally diverse K-12 setting;
- Successful experience teaching in a teacher education program or other graduate education program(s).
