- Proficiency in Spanish and/or teaching credential with Bilingual Authorization/Certification.

- Experience teaching preservice university courses in English language development, bilingual/multicultural education, and/or theory and instruction in disciplinary academic language and literacy for secondary school instruction.
- Experience mentoring or supervising teaching credential candidates
- Experience teaching in public school settings, grades 7-12.
- Experience with instructional technology supporting English learner/emergent bilingual students
